What is your mobile set up?

I have Kenwood V71A's in my vehicles and a Yaesu FTM-10SR on the motorcycle.

What are your favorite on air activities?

On 2 meters I do quite a few nets and Public Service events. On HF I like to chase some DX making first time contacts in countries worldwide. I'm still amazed that 100 watts and a wire gets you all around the world.

Why did you join CARS?

Taking the CARS Technicians Class included a year's free membership ... and the rest is history. They are great bunch of operators.

What would you like to see CARS do to improve?


